

## Mo-Kan Chapter Launched

The first meeting of the Mo-Kan Chapter of APCO was called to order at 1:30 p. m., April 25, at the Missouri Hotel, Jefferson City, by Lieut. Jack Wilt, temporary chairman, acting for Roy DeShaffon of the APCO Chapter Promotion Committee.

After introductions, Captain J. M. Wherritt spoke on the APCO and its work, emphasizing the place of the local chapters in the program of the national organization.

Inspector Wm. J. McDonell of the Federal Communications Commission gave his observations of the work of the organization.

Lieut. Wilt read some excerpts from the Illinois, Indiana, and Wisconsin Chapter constitutions on the classes of membership provided for by those groups. It was the general opinion that matter should be left to those who draw up the constitution.

Upon motion by Everett Cox, second by Roy DeShaffon, dues were set at \$3.00 per year.

"Red" Edwards presented the name "Mo-Kan Chapter, APCO," and after a general discussion it was adopted as the official name of the chapter.

It was the consensus of opinion that meetings could not be held more often than once each quarter; however, no definite dates were set.
